INTRODUCTION

Pony Club Victoria extends a warm welcome to everyone attending the 2022 Horseland State Championship. Mansfield Pony Club, on behalf of Pony Club Victoria, will host the Grade PCV110, 1, 2, 3 Horse Trials State Championships, together with the 2022 Interzone Teams Horse Trials Grades 4-5, for the first time and we thank them for taking on this challenge on PCV's behalf. In 1955 the first inter-branch competition was held by Mornington Peninsula Pony Club. The Horseland State Championships is an event conducted annually for qualified Grades PCV110, 1, 2 & 3 combinations of horse and rider.

COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The Horseland Pony Club Horse Trials State Championships comprises of three disciplines dressage, cross country and showjumping

All these disciplines are conducted on the same weekend and combinations (horse & rider) compete in all three disciplines.

A rider may compete in both Grades PCV110, 1, 2 and 3 on different qualified mounts at the Horseland State Horse Trials Championships.

The competition will be conducted on an individual basis with the organizing Committee distributing riders from each zone as evenly as possible throughout the sections.

ENTRY CONDITIONS

PCV Membership cards must be inspected thoroughly at qualifying competitions and by your Zone Representative who authorizes the entry to ensure eligibility is in accordance with the current rules.

Each combination (horse and rider) may only enter and compete in one grade.

A rider may nominate multiple mounts for the event in any grade however the combination can only compete once at the event.

Combinations must be eligible and qualified to enter this event.

The competition is conducted in accordance with the current PCV rules for the year in which the Championships are conducted.

CLUB TEAMS

Club teams will consist of 3 – 4 riders comprised of one grade PCV 110 or 1, 2 and 3 rider and one additional rider from Grades 1, 2, or 3. The best three scores will count.

COMPOSITE TEAMS

Composite teams will be accepted, made up from clubs who cannot field a team in their own right. Composite club teams are made up of a team of 3-4 riders on the same basis as club teams.

BALLOT

- The Organising Committee reserves the right to ballot entries.
- Second nominated mounts will only be accepted subject to sufficient space being available after all first nominated mounts have been accommodated.
- Riders must nominate their first preferred mount on the entry form, in case the second mount cannot be accepted.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Any rider wishing to compete in the State Horse Trials Championships must have attained a "C" Certificate if they are 14yrs+ unless the 14yrs+ rider has been a member for less than 2yrs.
- PCV Member cards are not required to be presented at the State Competition.
- All entries are to be signed off and authorised by the Zone Representative of your zone.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA (modified for 2022)

Combinations (horse & rider) must be eligible and qualified for the grade(s) in which they wish to enter. If you are waiting to compete in your 2ND qualifier, a rider may enter however your entry must be confirmed by your Zone Representative. In the event that you do not qualify your entry fees will be refunded in total (less credit and transaction fees)

- Qualifications must be gained during the 12 months preceding the championships.
- One qualification must have been gained in the calendar year of the championships.
- Event and Cross-Country jumping penalties must be noted on the rider's membership card.
- The previous year's championship may not be used as a qualification. (in 2022 PCV 110 combinations may use their 2021 PCV 110 State HT result)
- Specific grade qualification criteria and entry conditions apply.

GRADE PCV 110

Riders who have qualified can enter the PCV105 or PCV110. If there are insufficient entries for the 110 course riders will be placed in the Grade 1 Class.

- PCV110 combinations must complete two Horse Trials, one of which must be a PCV Accredited PCV110 event in the Pony Club or Open section or an EA

GRADE PCV 110 (Continued)

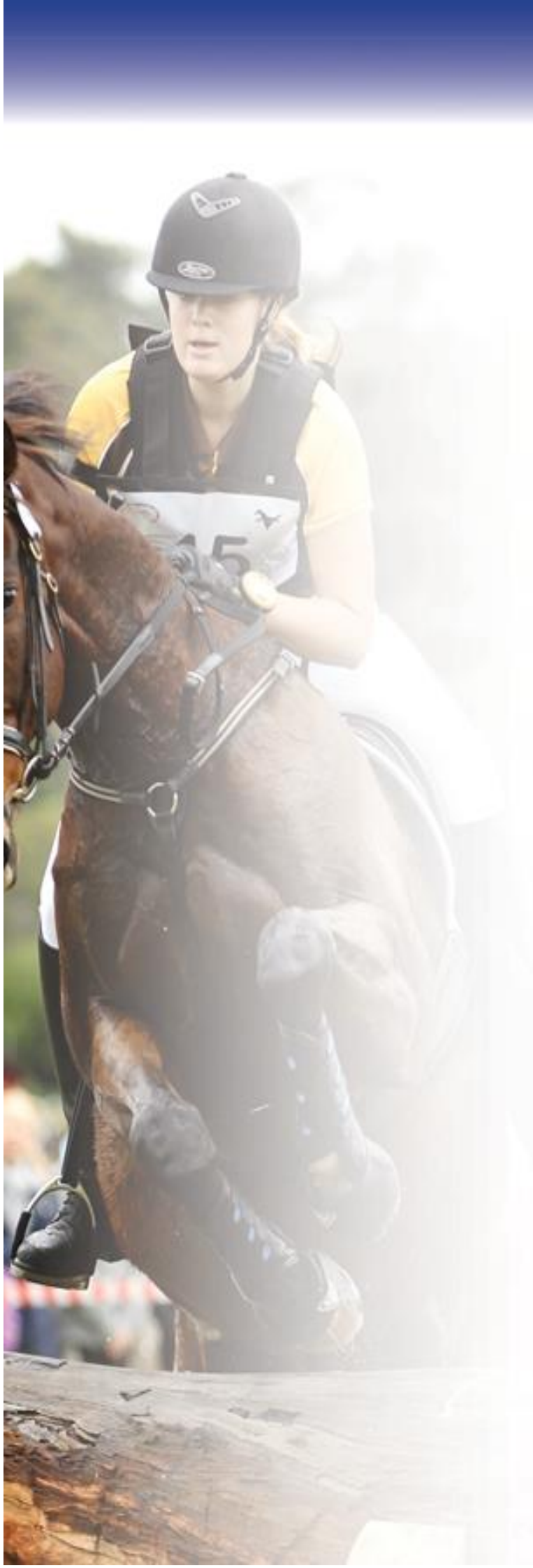
- An EA CCN1*- or a PCV Accredited PCV/Open Grade 1 event may be used as one qualification. Combinations graded as PCV110 Horse Trials may compete in PC Grade 1 Horse Trials events where a PCV110 class is not offered.
- 1 qualification must have been gained in the calendar year of the championships (in 2022 combinations may use their 2021 PCV 110 State HT result).
- 1 qualification with no more than 20 jumping penalties in the cross-country phase & one with zero jumping penalties in the cross-country phase.

GRADE 1

- Grade 1 combinations must complete two Horse Trials, one of which must be a PCV Accredited Grade 1 event in the Pony Club section.
- An EA CCN1*- or a PCV Accredited Open Grade 1 event may be used as one qualification. 1 or 2 events successfully completed at the PCV110 level will also be accepted as a qualification.
- 1 qualification must have been gained in the calendar year of the championships.
- 1 qualification with no more than 20 jumping penalties in the cross-country phase & one with zero jumping penalties in the cross-country phase.

GRADE 2

- Grade 2 combinations must complete two Horse Trials, one of which must be in a Pony Club section of a PCV Accredited Grade 2 Event.
- An EVA95 or a PCV Accredited Open Grade 2 event may be used as one qualification.
- 1 qualification must have been gained in the calendar year of the championships.
- 1 qualification with no more than 20 jumping penalties in the cross-country phase & one qualification with zero jumping penalties in the cross-country phase.



GRADE 3

- Grade 3 combinations must complete two Horse Trials, one of which must be in a Pony Club section of a PCV Accredited Grade 3 Event.
- An EVA 80 or a PCV Accredited Open Grade 3 event may be used as one qualification.
- 1 qualification must have been gained in the calendar year of the championships.
- 1 qualification with no more than 20 jumping penalties in the cross-country phase & one qualification with zero jumping penalties in the cross-country phase.

SUBSTITUTION

- If a combination that has been entered into the State Championships is subsequently unable to compete, another eligible combination may be substituted. However, the substitution must be:
- A combination that has qualified under the qualifying selection criteria.
- Endorsed by the Zone Representative
- Notified by the Zone Representative, to the Organising Secretary, not later than one hour before the commencement of the first event of the State Competition.

COMPETITION FORMAT INDIVIDUAL

The competition will be conducted on an individual basis. The Organising Committee will distribute riders from each Zone as evenly as possible throughout the sections.

CLUB TEAMS

Teams will consist of 3-4 riders and comprise of one Grade PCV110/1 rider, one Grade 2 rider, one Grade 3 rider and the remaining rider can be from any grade.

COMPETITION OVERVIEW

In 2003, the first Interzone Teams Horse Trials was conducted to give Grade 3 riders a state level event experience; the following year, Grade 4 riders were included and the Interzone Teams Horse Trials has continued annually, at Werribee, Yarrambat, PCVEC, Riddells Creek and Mansfield with Grades 4 & 5.

The Horseland Pony Club Interzone Teams Horse Trials comprises of three disciplines Dressage, Cross Country and Showjumping.

Combinations compete in all three disciplines. Grade 4 ride their Dressage Test and Showjumping on the Saturday with their Cross Country on the Sunday. Grade 5 ride their Dressage on Saturday with their Showjumping & Cross Country on the Sunday.

HOW TO ENTER

- Zone Representatives will place you in a team for the event, composite teams will be made up where possible to ensure as many riders get to be a part of this event.
- Eligible riders selected to represent their Zone will be emailed a link to enter.

COMPETITION FORMAT

TEAM EVENT: Teams will consist of 3-4 riders organised into teams by the Zone Representative.

COMPETITION CONDITIONS RULES & POLICIES

The competitions are conducted in accordance with the current PCV Rules for the year in which the Championship is conducted.

GEAR CHECK

Gear check required for prior to each discipline as per current PCV gear rules.

TEAM MANAGER

Each team must have a nominated Team Manager. Queries and protests will only be accepted by the Team Manager.

ENTRY CONDITIONS

- PCV Membership cards must be inspected thoroughly by your Zone Representative who authorises the entry to ensure eligibility is in accordance with the current rules.
- Each combination (horse and rider) may only enter and compete in one grade.
- A rider may nominate multiple mounts for the event in any grade however any combination can only compete once at the event.

Riders must be eligible and qualified to enter this event.

BALLOT

- The Organising Committee reserves the right to ballot entries.
- Second nominated mounts will only be accepted subject to sufficient space being available and after all first nominated mounts have been accommodated.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA (modified for 2022)

GRADE 4 –

- Grade 4 combinations must complete two Horse Trials, one of which must be in a Pony Club section of a PCV Accredited Grade 4 Event.
- An EVA65 or a PCV Accredited Open Grade 4 event may be used as one qualification.
- 1 qualification must have been gained in the calendar year of the championships.
- 1 qualification with no more than 20 jumping penalties in the cross-country phase & one qualification with zero jumping penalties in the cross-country phase.

GRADE 5

- Grade 5 combinations must complete two Horse Trials, one of which must be in a Pony Club section of a PCV Accredited Grade 5 Event.
- A PCV Accredited Open Grade 5 event may be used as one qualification.
- 1 qualification must have been gained in the calendar year of the championships.
- 1 qualification with no more than 20 jumping penalties in the cross-country phase & one qualification with zero jumping penalties in the cross-country phase

COMPETITOR NUMBERS

Competitor identification, in the form of body numbers, will be supplied by the organisers as A4 paper inserts. Competitor numbers can be found in the FINAL official draw which will be published on the PCV website.

Competitors must provide their own A4 size number holder - This must be worn in all phases of the competition. An alternative fabric bib of a similar size and displaying the correct number front and back is also acceptable.

SUBSTITUTION

If a combination that has been entered into the State Championships is subsequently unable to compete, another eligible combination may be substituted. However, the substitution must be:

- Endorsed by the Zone Representative
- Notified by the Zone Representative, to the Organising Secretary, not later than one hour before the commencement of the first event of the State Competition.

AWARDS

Presentations will be unmounted, and full uniform must be worn, helmet optional.

TEAMS (Grade 4 & 5)

1st Place - Rugs & Sashes

2nd - 6th Place - Sashes

OVERALL ZONE CHAMPIONS

Scores from the top 2 Grade 4 & Grade 5 teams are added for each zone. The winning zone is awarded the Interzone Teams Challenge Perpetual Shield.

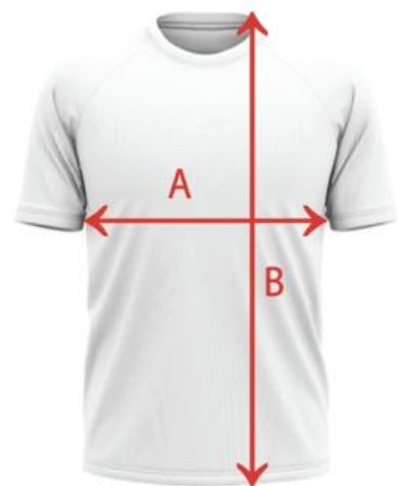
